APS POLICY De-Clawing Decoded



Why?

The reasons behind our contract to not to de-claw cats or kittens adopted from APS-FH takes shape

from our mission statement. It is our mission to protect the welfare of animals and the potential dangers from the elective surgery of de-clawing (amputating the last digit from each 'finger') putting felines at risk for serious complications.

For those unfamiliar with the surgery, a few facts and the reasons behind our policy:

- INFECTION, resulting from surgery or simply from litter boxes or soil during recovery
- NO DEFENSE, from predators or other felines
- PERMANENT PARALYSIS
- DEPRESSION
- OBESITY

Simply put, for safety and quality of life APS-FH stands behind our mission to protect the welfare of felines by asking you not de-claw your adopted kitty. **Community** Connections

Community Foundation for Foster Pets

Each year the APS places many wonderful pets into foster care homes. Life at the shelter for pets with medical



issues can be difficult, and to improve their lives we count on foster families. When these pets with ongoing medical needs are placed in foster care the

APS helps pay for most medical expenses. This year we anticipated spending close to \$5,000 on ongoing expenses such as insulin, thyroid medication, special dietary foods, teeth extractions and blood work.

The San Juan Island Community Foundation generously offered to include APS-FH in its *MATCHING GRANTS* Program at the fair this year. In 4 days at the fair we reached our goal; donors from the community pledged \$4,000 in donations and SJICF matched with \$1,000.

Feral cats took center stage at the shelter this year. APS-FH was called to help with Trap, Neuter, Return (TNR) of the many feral cats sighted in and around the Federal, State and County Parks on the Island as well as several feral colonies in various locations. All which had grown out of control.

A huge thank you to our Island residents, who

once again stood tall at the plate. Greg and Patty Black personally trapped over 30 ferals on their property. They were brought to the shelter in small batches to be spayed or neutered and later returned to the Black Farm where the family continues to provide food and shelter for the felines. Other islander's responded with open hearts to a recent articll in The Journal of the San Juans regarding the plight of feral cats and kittens. Thank you island community for your very generous response - we received many donations, large and small, totaling over \$3,000 to help with the veterinarian expenses. We also send a thank you to Dr. Susan Besel and Dr. Sue Poirot of Harbor Veterinary Services for accommodating the extra volume of surgeries. Together we made a real difference in pet overpopulation on our little island.
